

In the quiet town of Sojat, Rajasthan, where the fragrance of henna lingers in the air, lived a young boy named Ramchandra; a dreamer in a world that offered little space for dreams. Each day, he watched his parents, Tejaram and Reema Devi, work tirelessly just to secure two simple meals. His father, once a small vegetable seller, took up strenuous labor in a henna factory from dawn till dusk. His mother labored at construction sites, her hands worn and bruised. Their struggle weighed on Ramchandra's heart not as despair, but as a vow. In the weary slump

of their shoulders, he also saw unwavering love and silent courage. And from that, a spark was born: He would rise so they could finally rest.

"My parents would come home late in the evening. So, being the eldest at home, I used to prepare the evening meal in our open kitchen open wood-fired mud stove in our courtyard," says Ram.

How do I break this cycle? How do I build something better?

That spark became the beginning of a remarkable journey.

Ramchandra studied in a Hindi-medium



government school and excelled in academics. When he scored outstanding marks in Class 10, his parents enrolled him at ALLEN, believing in his potential even when resources were scarce. This was the turning point.

As a young software engineer in Bengaluru, his innovative spirit flourished as he developed a groundbreaking algorithm for wireless networking security. His journey soared even higher when he was recruited by Google, leading him to the Seattle (USA) office, a profound transformation from a mud-stove kitchen to a global technology front.

Giving Back as Roots Matter

For Ram, success is incomplete unless shared. Through his organization Shantidham, he now provides free education to 400 girls. He takes leave from Google to personally mentor Class 11



and 12 students ensuring no child with talent stays behind due to circumstance. His compassion is visible not just in words, but in action like preparing a girl for JEE after she lost her father.

From welding sparks to Microsoft innovation

Vatsalya's Brilliance and Leap of Vision



Dreams know no boundaries of wealth or place; when courage meets opportunity, even a welding spark can outshine the brightest lights.

In a small corner of Khagaria district, Bihar, where most families struggle to make ends meet, a young boy named Vatsalya Singh Chauhan dreamt beyond the boundaries of his circumstances. His father, Chandrakant Singh, runs a small welding and grill shop to support a family of six children. Despite limited means, Vatsalya's brilliance and hard work illuminated a path that led him from a local government school to the global corridors of Microsoft.

After scoring 75% in Class 12 from a Hindi-medium government school, Vatsalya's potential was recognized by his teachers, who advised his father to pursue engineering coaching. Determined to give his son a fair chance, his father enrolled Vatsalya at ALLEN. Vatsalya's journey was never about personal success alone. Even during his IIT years, he spent his free time teaching children of auto drivers and underprivileged families. He, along with his IIT peers, started an initiative called Parivartan, aimed at bringing quality education to rural Bihar. With support from local organizations, they have acquired land to establish a model school in Khagaria, focusing on experimental learning for underprivileged children.

For Kheraj Ram, becoming a doctor was more than achieving a dream; it was the fulfillment of his father's lifelong hope. His father, Jugataram, worked as a porter at Jodhpur railway station, earning a meager 100-150 rupees a day. Some days he returned home empty-handed, yet he never gave up on his son's education. Kheraj's mother, Nouji Devi, worked as a laborer, and together they did everything possible to support his learning.

Kheraj grew up in the village of Saranoo Seemanji near Barmer, studying in a government school with no electricity. He often read under the dim light of a chimney and during exams, studied at his grandfather's

house. From an early age, he witnessed his father's struggle and determination; a reminder of what hard work could achieve even in difficult circumstances. When Kheraj scored 79% in his Rajasthan Board Class 12 exams, it marked a turning point in his journey. His father, Kaluram, works as a skilled laborer, and his mother, Shanti Devi, is employed under NREGA. Their modest home of mud and bricks, limited land, and minimal formal education could have easily restricted his dreams, but Champalal refused to settle for limitations.

The eldest of five siblings, he studied in the local government school and scored 58% in

Class 10. Despite limited resources, his resolve only strengthened. He moved to Jodhpur for further studies, where he completed Class 12 with 69%, laying the foundation for his medical aspirations.

A Friend Became a Guiding Light & Enlightened Hope

In every great journey, someone extends a hand. For Champalal, that person was his friend Khairajaram Choudhary; a student who had once walked the same difficult path.

Khairajaram, an ALLEN alumnus, recognized Champalal's potential and guided him to join ALLEN Career Institute. Not only did he mentor him academically, but his family also offered financial support, ensuring that money would not become the barrier that stops a dream.

From a Puncture Shop to a White Coat

For Rinku, becoming a doctor was not just about fulfilling his own dream; it was the realization of his elder brother Sunil's deepest hope. The family lived in Shivpuri district, where Sunil ran a small roadside puncture shop to earn a modest livelihood. Their father, Giriraj, worked on their four-bigha agricultural land, growing just enough to sustain the family, while their mother, Usha Bai, managed the home with warmth and strength. Resources were limited, but dreams were not.



A Brother's Sacrifice That
Shaped a Doctor

Rinku studied in a government school, securing 57% in Class 10 and 67% in Class 12 under the Madhya Pradesh Board. Though his scores showed potential, the financial reality at home forced him to set aside his studies for a year. During this period, the thought of joining his brother at the puncture shop loomed large, and his dream of becoming a doctor seemed to be slipping away.

A Brother's Vision and Faith

Sunil had seen what Rinku was capable of even when Rinku himself began to doubt. Though Sunil's education ended after the 10th grade, his understanding of the value of education ran deep. Supporting his wife and three children, he still chose to prioritize his younger brother's future.

"Paise ki chinta mat karna. Tum padhai shuru karo. Main dekh loonga."



("Do not worry about money. Just start studying. I will handle the rest.")

These words became Rinku's turning point; an act of faith that shaped his destiny.

In 2018, with savings collected over months of hard labor, Sunil enrolled Rinku at ALLEN Career Institute. Manohar's Weave of Dreams

In the quiet village of Mehrangarh, nestled amidst the barren lands of Barmer district (Rajasthan), lives a story that redefines possibility. Amid the mud-walled homes of weavers and daily laborers, Manohar Lal, the son of a humble artisan, dared to dream beyond the loom and the fields.

Born to Narsingharam and Durga Devi, who toiled day and night weaving cloth and working as laborers under the NREGA scheme, Manohar grew up understanding struggle before success. Yet, what his family lacked in means, they made up for in perseverance and belief. Even as a child, Manohar's brilliance stood out. Scoring 83% in Class 10, he earned admiration from his teachers, who urged him to study science, a rare pursuit



in his village. With no senior secondary school nearby, he walked 6 KM daily to attend classes in a neighboring area. Dusty roads, scorching summers, and harsh winds never stopped him. Education was his hope, and every step was a promise to his parents that their sacrifices would one day bear fruit.

A New Dawn: The ASHA Project

From Being Mocked to Being Respected

Arvind's Path to the White Coat

For Arvind Kumar, securing admission to a medical college was not just the fulfillment of a dream; it was a statement. A response to the quiet pain his family had carried for years. His father, named Bhikhari, worked as a scrap collector, and society did not hesitate to judge both his profession and his name. People made remarks that left deep marks, but Arvind chose to answer it not with words, but with achievement.

Arvind hails from Baradi village in Kushinagar, Uttar Pradesh. His father

worked far away in Jamshednagar, nearly 900 kilometers from home, collecting scrap in unpredictable circumstances. On some days, he returned with around ₹300 - ₹400, and on others, he came back with nothing. Yet, he continued tirelessly, believing in his children's future.

Arvind attended a government school and traveled 8 KM daily by bicycle. His academic start was not extraordinary; he secured 48% in Class 10 and 60% in Class 12. But grades did not reflect the clarity in his heart: he wanted to make his parents stand tall, with dignity.



ALLEN Support When Needed the Most

Though many people tried to discourage the family, Arvind's teachers recognized his seriousness and suggested ALLEN. His father, despite limited income and no understanding of competitive exams, decided to support his son's decision.


Sai Lost Her Father to Covid...



From Shepherd Fields to Stethoscopes

Two Sisters Who Turned Struggles Into Success

In the quiet village of Nangal Tulsidas near Jaipur, two young sisters Ritu and Kareena spent their childhood among shepherd fields, grazing goats, helping their mothers in the farm, and studying under dim lantern light. Their fathers two shepherd brothers, Hanuman Sahay and Nanchu Ram worked tirelessly just to keep food on the table. The family already lived with almost nothing, but fate still tested them harder.

Ritu's father, Hanuman Sahay, began losing his eyesight first a blur, then shadows, and eventually darkness. Kareena's father, Nanchu Ram, was diagnosed with lung cancer, his strength declining breath by breath.

Kareena continued her studies at home, earning 81 percent in the 10th grade and an impressive 83 percent in the 12th grade. These accomplishments were remarkable given the limited resources and challenging circumstances they faced.

The Mentor Who Carried Their Unspoken Dreams

The family had no way to fund NEET preparation. But destiny arrived in the shape of their elder uncle Thakarsi Yadav. Once a brilliant science student himself, he too had dreamed of becoming a doctor. But poverty had ended that dream before it could begin. When he saw the same spark in Ritu and Kareena, he did not let history repeat.

He enrolled them at ALLEN, supported their stay, stood

In the remote Sodiya village of Chauhan region, Barmer (Rajasthan), dreams rarely bloom easily. But for Derajram, the son of a mandi labourer, hardship became his greatest teacher. His father, Ghevaram, works as a porter, battling not just poverty but also physical disability.

In 2021, while still in Class 12, Derajram appeared for NEET on his own and scored only 148 marks. Though he enrolled in a B.Sc. course, his heart remained set on medicine. He told his family, "I will become a doctor, no matter what." He appeared again in NEET 2022 and scored 380 marks. 



Just weeks before JEE Main, Paramveer developed persistent coughing and chest pain. Initial treatment provided no relief, and after the exam, doctors diagnosed him with tuberculosis. The treatment caused significant side effects such as loss of appetite, fatigue, increased sleep, and the need for strict dietary and liquid intake. Despite these challenges, Paramveer did not let his condition hinder his goal.

With strong conceptual clarity and guidance from ALLEN teachers, Paramveer adapted to studying while resting in bed, ensuring continuity in his JEE Advanced preparation. Through discipline, focus, and perseverance, Paramveer gave the exam with confidence and secured an impressive AIR 203 in JEE Advanced. He had earlier achieved AIR 664 in JEE Main.

From Donating Bone Marrow to NEET

Riturima's Extraordinary Fight for Her Dreams

L ife tested HHriturima Baidya in ways no student is ever prepared for. Her world changed the day her younger sister, Madhurima, just 15 years old, was diagnosed with cancer. Amid this emotional storm, HHriturima continued her studies and completed her Class 10 with a perfect 10 CGPA. A resident of Udaipur village in Tripura, she joined ALLEN, to prepare for NEET, carrying with her not just books and ambitions, but the emotional weight of her sister's battle for life.

Her perseverance bore fruit when she cracked NEET 2024 with AIR 1274 and OBC Rank 319, all while supporting her family through their darkest days. Her father, Khokan Chandra Baidya, runs a small shop, and her mother, Ratna Dutta, is a homemaker.



The Diagnosis That Shook the Family

Hriturima recalls that when she was in Class 10 and her sister in Class 9, Madhurima suddenly felt weak. Within days, her face became severely swollen. Tests revealed Non-Hodgkin Lymphoma PMBCL, a cancer that affects the immune cells.

Doctors advised immediate treatment. Her mother and uncle left with Madhurima, while

Hriturima stayed back with her father. The tumor was located between the heart and lungs, making surgery impossible. Treatment began with chemotherapy and after 8 months, there was slight improvement, but a follow-up scan revealed the worst: the cancer had spread further and had reached the lungs.

Strength From a Supportive Ecosystem

Hriturima attended several motivational sessions, and received continuous guidance from ALLEN faculty. This emotional support helped her stay positive, composed, and mentally strong through the toughest phase of her life.

Donated Bone Marrow to Save Her Sister


Just two months into coaching, doctors recommended a bone marrow transplant. When

tests were conducted, the bone marrow of both parents did not match but Hriturima's did. She went to Mumbai and stayed there for three weeks for the transplant procedure. Multiple pre- and post-procedure visits followed, all while she continued her studies.

A Community That Stood with Her

The transplant cost nearly ₹20 lakh, forcing the family to approach various organizations for help. The institute provided fee concession and ALLEN faculty collectively contributed ₹4 lakh. Because of her frequent Mumbai visits, she missed many classes, but ALLEN teachers helped her cover the syllabus, clear her doubts, and stay on track.

In the world of education, few stories embody courage and perseverance like that of Tuhin Dey; a young boy from Midnapore, West Bengal, who turned physical limitations into his greatest source of strength. Diagnosed with cerebral palsy, leaving only his neck and head mobile,

Tuhin proved that a resilient mind can conquer even the toughest challenges.

Born on March 11, 1999, Tuhin studied at Central School, IIT Kharagpur campus, till Class 9, where his brilliance began to shine early. A recipient of the NTSE scholarship, he learned programming



languages like C, C++, Java, and HTML, using technology as his voice and expression. His exceptional creativity earned national recognition: the Best Creative Child Award (2012) and the Exceptional Achievement Award (2013) both presented by President Pranab Mukherjee.

Later, in 2019, he was honored by Union Minister Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank' under the Education Struggle and Excellence category.

Inspired by Stephen Hawking, Tuhin dreams of contributing to astrophysics research, a vision as vast as the cosmos itself.

Broke Barriers and Reached New Heights

Cancer Survivor to Aspiring Doctor

Abhishek's Story of Strength

The power of determination often defines the line between surrender and success. Abhishek Kumar Roy, a student from Panagarh (West Bengal), exemplifies this truth. At just six years old, Abhishek was diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma, a rare blood cancer. Chemotherapy began immediately, offering a fragile lifeline. Yet in 2008, cancer returned, this time in his abdomen. For ten long years, his world revolved around hospitals and uncertainty. In 2012, thyroid problems emerged, followed by recurring kidney stones and severe weakness. His hair fell, his eyesight worsened (minus 8.5 lenses), and exhaustion shadowed each day.



Compassion Inspired and Sparked an Aspiration

Amid such trials, the compassion of the doctors who treated him became his inspiration. He resolved that one day he too would wear the white coat; not as a patient, but as a healer. Abhishek excelled in studies, securing 9.8 CGPA in Class 10 and 73 percent in Class 12. With his businessman father and homemaker mother's support, he chose to prepare for NEET at ALLEN. Recognising his circumstances, ALLEN Career Institute extended a 50 percent fee concession and provided special academic support. His mother stayed beside him, managing his medicines and diet while he studied up to 11 hours a day with quiet determination.

Success That Healed the Painful Struggle

Anubhav's Rise to IIT Bombay

Determination can turn even the toughest challenges into stepping stones, and Anubhav Chandra's story is a living example. For two years, he battled recurring health issues but never let his studies or dream of joining IIT Bombay falter. Originally from Chhattisgarh, Anubhav secured 1030 rank in the OBC category and 6050 in the General category in JEE Advanced. Fascinated by

astrophysics, he knew that pursuing research in this field was possible only after studying at IIT. He enrolled in ALLEN to prepare for the highly competitive IIT entrance exams.

The Fall That Could Have Broken Him

On the day of JEE Advanced, he completed the first paper with a painful hand and took a painkiller for the second paper to give his best performance.

The Pillars of His Success

Anubhav's journey was made possible by constant support from both family and mentors. The ALLEN faculty guided him through difficult concepts, monitored his test performance, and provided personalized advice to recover lost ground after his health setbacks. At home, his mother, Sheetal Chandra, stayed with him for two years, keeping him motivated and positive, while his father, Brijesh Chandra, supported him from Goa. Even when doctors suggested returning home due to ongoing health issues, Anubhav continued studying, steadily improving his rank in ALLEN's internal tests. Each challenge became a lesson in perseverance, fueling his path to IIT.

From Liver Donor Daughter to Healing Lives

Sneha's Inspiring Tale of Perseverance

Sneha Shravani Nayak from Paradip, Odisha, faced extraordinary challenges on her path to becoming a doctor. Excelling academically from the start, she scored 91.33% in class 10 and 90.58% in class 12. Driven by her dream of studying medicine, she moved to Kota in 2022 to prepare for the NEET exam at ALLEN. Shortly after, her father, Hemant Kumar Nayak, whose health had been fragile due to fatty liver and other ailments, faced a critical medical emergency. Doctors in Hyderabad recommended a liver transplant as the only life-saving solution.





Sacrifice and Determination

On the very day of her father's diagnosis, Sneha achieved Rank-1 in her first major test at ALLEN. The diagnosis, however, necessitated urgent action, and only immediate family members aged between 18 and 40 years could donate their liver. At just 18 years and 2 months old, she was the only eligible donor. In the face of this daunting challenge, Sneha reached out to her ALLEN faculties and mentors, who offered staunch support and encouraged her.

Sneha underwent a rigorous medical evaluation, lost 3 kgs in 6 days. On October 10, 2022, she donated 68% of her liver in a 13-hour surgery, which also involved gall bladder removal. Her recovery was marked by abdominal pain, sleep difficulties, and the need for painkillers. The family faced severe financial strain, spending around 60 lakh rupees on treatment, seeking help from relatives, and even selling her mother's jewelry. Their printing press, once a source of income, was shut due to her father's health.

After a month and a half following the surgery, her father's operation revealed unexpected complications, and despite their best efforts, sadly he passed away on February 9, 2023. Sneha personally managed his final rites, a heart-wrenching moment that tested her courage and strength.


From Loss to Achieve Success

50 days after her father's passing, Sneha's ALLEN mentors encouraged her to return to resume her NEET preparation. With support from hostel authorities, she refocused on her studies and performed well, securing Rank-1 in the first test, Rank-19 in the second, Rank-4 in the third, and Rank-13 in the fifth minor test. Even after returning in January, she achieved 55th rank in a test after only four days of preparation. In the NEET UG 2023, she scored 602/720 with an AIR 27,593. She went on to pursue MBBS at Govt. Medical College Sundhargarh, Odisha, moving closer to her dream of becoming a doctor.

Divyansh's Journey from Challenges to Victory

Divyansh, from Charkhi Dadri, Haryana, grew up in a family devoted to serving the nation. His father, Jitendra, is a Naib Subedar in the Indian Army, and several family members have served in the armed forces. Initially, Divyansh aspired to join the Army, but his father encouraged him to serve society as a doctor. From Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar, Maharashtra, Abhinit Bhalerao's journey began with a rare and formidable challenge: Kyphoscoliosis, a rare condition causing an abnormal spinal curvature. This resulted in severe physical limitations, including a weaker left side of his body, difficulty hearing, and reduced oxygen flow to his brain when studying, often causing him to faint. Many doctors initially advised his parents to terminate the pregnancy, but his father refused, saying: "However he is, he is ours. We will make him capable enough that he becomes an example for others."



Despite frequent bouts of fainting and health struggles, Abhinit excelled academically from the beginning, scoring 89% in Class 10 and 72% in Class 12. His father's dream of seeing him become a doctor became his own mission.

Strength Beyond Limits

With courage as his constant companion, Abhinit joined ALLEN, Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar, and set his sights on cracking NEET. He often fainted in class, experienced stomach problems, and had difficulty breathing due to the curvature of his spine, limiting space for his lungs and intestines. His doctor advised him not to study with his neck bent for more than 10 minutes at a stretch. Crucially, the ALLEN team, including the Centre Head, Medical Head, and the faculty, provided tremendous support. They prepared a customized schedule and set achievable goals for him, enabling Abhinit to continue his studies successfully.

hen Lance Naik Kharg Singh of the 12th Jat Regiment sacrificed his life during the Kargil War on May 6, 1999, he left behind a grieving widow, Manohari Devi, and four young children. Sunita, the eldest, was just eight, and Babli,

the youngest, barely eight months old. Life's hardships compounded as the family struggled with financial constraints, and the challenge of raising children without a father. In the face of this tragedy, Manohari Devi and her brother

Naveen Kasana vowed to provide the children with education, to pursue their dreams.

ALLEN' Incredible Support

The path to medicine was neither smooth nor easy. Sunita led the way, joining ALLEN, where structured guidance, and a disciplined environment helped her grow academically and personally. She cracked NEET UG and secured admission to Dr. Sampurnanand Medical College, Jodhpur. Her success inspired her siblings Mamta, Sandeep, and Babli to follow suit. Mamta cleared NEET in 2016, Sandeep in 2017, while Babli cracked it in 2019.

The institute's Shaurya Scholarship which has

benefited numerous children of martyrs, played a vital role in easing financial burdens, granting Babli and Sandeep 90% fee support for 2 years. Today, all four continue their medical journey: Dr. Sunita Gurjar serves as a MO at the PHC in Bhilwara; Mamta is pursuing MBBS at SMS Jaipur; and Babli and Sandeep are studying at Army Medical College, Delhi.

Grandma's Support: Defying All Odds for Girls' Education

Dr. Sunita Gurjar shared that in her community, there was a general perception that girls shouldn't be educated beyond a certain level. The mindset was to marry them off at a young

age and focus on providing a substantial dowry instead of investing in their education. However, their grandma, Pataashi Devi, stood firm and boldly declared, "My granddaughters will make our name shine wherever they go," and her words proved prophetic.

A Father's Dream

Earlier, people would recognize her as "Shaheed Kharg Singh ki beti Sunita," which would fill her heart with pride. But now, when people say "Doctor Sunita, Shaheed Kharg Singh ki beti hai," the feeling is indescribable. This is because her father's dream was for all four of his children to receive the best education.

Rupa's Inspiring Flight Beyond Barriers

From Child Bride to Compassionate Medical Officer

Born on July 5, 1996, in Kariri village, Jaipur district (Rajasthan), Rupa grew up in a modest farming family. The youngest of five siblings, she attended the local government school. At just eight years old, she was married, along with her elder sister, to two brothers from a nearby village; her husband Shankarlal was only twelve.

For most girls in her situation, education ends with early marriage, but Rupa chose a different path. She faced societal criticism, whispered

judgments, and the weight of expectations that told her to settle into domestic life. Yet, she refused to let those boundaries define her.

Her dream of becoming a doctor was born out of personal pain; her uncle once suffered greatly due to the lack of proper medical care. That moment planted a lifelong purpose in her heart. With her father's encouragement, she joined a private school in a neighboring village and scored 84% in Class 10.

Even when relatives and villagers questioned the need for her education, her husband and brother-in-law stood by her, ensuring

A Turning Point with ALLEN

In her first NEET attempt, she scored 506 marks; in her second, 603 marks, achieving an All India Rank 2283 and securing admission to SPMC Bikaner Medical College. Balancing sleepless nights and medical textbooks, she completed her MBBS in 2023 and now serves as a Medical Officer, preparing for NEET-PG (OBG-MS); where she hopes to support women facing challenges like hers.

From Pachpahad village in Jhalawar district, Nazia grew up in a home where each day was shaped by hard work and sacrifice. Her father, Isamuddin, drives a tempo on loan in Bhawanimandi to support the family, while her mother, Amina Bi, works in others' fields when needed. With two younger siblings still studying, every rupee mattered yet her father stood firm against those who questioned the need to educate a girl. Nazia studied in the village school till Class 8, and from Class 9 to 12, she cycled 5 km daily to reach a government school in Bhawanimandi.



My father was told that educating a daughter is a waste, but he never stepped back. ALLEN believed in my ability. Every step I take now carries my family's hope and the dreams of many girls from my village. - Nazia

The path was not easy. Limited resources, no strong academic background at home, and constant remarks from society about “a daughter studying too much.” But Nazia held onto her dream of becoming a doctor not just for herself, but for every girl who had been told to stay small.

A Dream Nourished Right

Recognizing her determination and circumstances, ALLEN Career Institute supported her with a 75% scholarship, reducing the financial strain that could have stopped her dream. Ramlal's Fight for Education

From Child Marriage to Medical College

From Ghonsunda village in Chittorgarh district, Rajasthan, Ramlal Bhoi grew up in a family where education was not a priority. At the age of 11, while still in Class 6, he was married according to traditional customs. For many children, this would have marked the end of schooling. But for Ramlal, it became the beginning of a fight; a fight to continue learning, to choose his own future, and to dream beyond what society prescribed.

Ramlal's parents had never been to school, and his father believed education beyond 10th grade was unnecessary. There were days when Ramlal was discouraged, criticized, and even punished for insisting on studying further. But two things stood strong with him; his own determination and the quiet support of his young wife, who put

aside her own dreams so that he could pursue his. With effort and persistence, Ramlal passed Class 10 with 74% and later scored 81% in Class 12 in 2019. During a trip to Udaipur, he first learned about NEET and realized that becoming a doctor could transform not just his life, but his entire family's future.

When Effort Found Direction

Ramlal attempted NEET several times through self-study, scoring 350 marks in 2019, 320 in 2020, and 362 in 2021. His teachers, moved by his sincerity, encouraged him for

proper guidance. The financial obstacles were overwhelming, yet Ramlal did not step back. When he finally reached ALLEN, the institute recognized both his hardship and potential, offering him a scholarship that made continuing his preparation possible. A 20-year-old girl, who was married off when she was just eight, is all set to become a doctor after clearing the CBSE undergraduate National Entrance-cum-Eligibility Test (NEET) for medical education.

Unlike most child brides, Rupa Yadav did not let early marriage eclipse her life. She continued her education, undertook coaching in Kota and cleared the test in her third attempt.

Rupa scored 603 in the NEET and is undergoing counselling now. She hopes to get admission in a government medical college. Youngest among five siblings, Rupa was in class 3 when she was married off at age eight.

It was when her uncle Bhimaram Yadav passed away of cardiac arrest, due to lack of medical assistance, that Rupa decided to become a doctor.

In her first attempt at the AIPT, she scored 415 marks and was ranked 23,000. In her last attempt at NEET, she improved her score and scored 503 after a year of coaching.

Rupa wanted to train another year at Kota but her family's financial condition was proving to be a roadblock. It was at this crucial moment when a private institute — Allen coaching — waived 75 per cent of her fees. But the rest of the fee and staying in Kota was still a challenge.
